To take on such office, as a representative of your peers, requires the approbation of your constituents. To that end, this document serves as notice of intent to contest a seat on the Parnassus Student Senate. Please carefully read through all of the enclosed information and complete all requisite articles.

I. Student Senate:

Purpose: To represent the interests of one's grade level in the School of Rhetoric. To build school spirit and uphold the eight character pillars of Parnassus.

Composition: Parnassus Student Senate shall be composed of twelve representatives, with three members sitting per level of the School of Rhetoric. Officers of the senate shall be elected from within the sitting representatives.

Code of Conduct: All members will be held to the highest personal and ethical standards. All members must be aware that should they fail to meet the standards enumerated below, they may be removed from their office.

Completion of Form: In order to be considered for office, and stand in elections, this form must be completed in its entirety.

Campaign: All candidates will be given up to five minutes to speak on their own behalf in front of their class during 4th hour. Should you deliver a speech that does not meet the expectations of the office, your teacher may withhold your application, thus nullifying your candidacy. A copy of all speeches must be e-mailed to your Homeroom (4th hour) teacher on or before Friday, September 17th for review.

VI. Notice of Election:

In order for review, you must submit your speech to your Homeroom (4th Hour) teacher by Friday, September 17th. Campaign speeches will be delivered during 4th hour on Wednesday, September 22nd with elections immediately following. New Senators will be announced later in the week. Elected senators in 3R and 4R will then be allowed to run for President/Vice President. All President/Vice President candidates must submit their speech to Magister Bennett by Monday, September 27th. President/Vice President speeches will be delivered on Wednesday, September 29th during SOR lunch, with elections to follow. The winners will be announced on Thursday, September 30th. Student Senate will sit for their first meeting in Magister Bennett's room (1308) on Thursday, October 7th at 3:35pm.

When all information is complete, election packets should be submitted to Magister Bennett.
