General Costume Guidelines

- Costume choices must be school appropriate and academic in nature.
- Historical figures must come from the Parnassus curriculum.
- We will be having a special and fun day but our focus will remain on teaching and learning. Please ensure that costumes do not impede normal movement.
- Costumes should not include any weapons, real or fake.
- Please ensure that costumes are culturally sensitive and do not portray a race or culture in a negative and/or stereotypical way. If in doubt, check with a teacher.
- Students who do not wish to participate in the dress-up day should wear their school uniforms in accordance with the normal school uniform policy.
- A solid color facemask is required at school, however students are welcome to match their mask to their costume. No face paint or other face-covering items are allowed.
