


## How to Van Gogh Sunflowers

Start at the middle bottom of the page!




**1.** Draw a vase near the bottom of the page.




**2.** Draw a circle above the vase. Draw circles and ovals around your main circle.




**3.** On your main circle add petals. It's ok to draw over the other flowers!




**4.** Draw petals around another circle. See if you can hide the petals behind the first flower.




**5.** Add more petals, this time trying different shapes and sizes.




**6.** Try drawing a flower from the side. Start with an oval and add tails, turn them into petals.



**7.** Continue to draw petals, tucking them all behind the main flower.



**8.** Draw a line to close the opening of the vase. It might run into a flower, so make sure the "jump" over the flower.



**9.** Finally add stems and perhaps decorate your vase with simple lines.


#### **E-Learning Day Essay**


Instructions: For this assignment, you are going to complete a response to literature essay, just like you have done in previous reading classes. This essay should follow the following prompt:






## **Jazz Greats: John Coltrane**

John Coltrane was born in 1926 in Hamlet, North Carolina. Inspired by

his father, who played many different instruments, young John began studying the E-flat horn and clarinet. As a teen, influenced by musicians such as Lester Young, John switched to the alto saxophone, the instrument he would become famous for playing.

John served in the military during World War II, and he made his first recordings during that time.


After the war, he joined the band led by jazz and blues great Eddie Vinson, which exposed him to new ways of playing the saxophone. In 1960, Coltrane recorded the album Giant Steps, made up of his own compositions. In the same year, he formed his first quartet. Their first recording together was also his debut playing soprano saxophone.



Coltrane continued to win awards even after death. Among others, he was awarded a Grammy for "Best Jazz Solo Performance" in 1982, and a Grammy Lifetime Achievement Award in 1997.
